

How Wikipedia got better than ever in 2023-2024

The Wikipedia that you read today is different from the Wikipedia that you've read in previous years. It has more knowledge than ever. It has more languages than ever. And it has something else that continues to make Wikipedia unique in the world: It's the largest shared knowledge source in human history — a compendium of more than 60 million articles that more people rely on than ever. The more the world changes, the more the world turns to Wikipedia.

That's why the 2023-2024 fiscal year was such a milestone year for the Wikimedia projects: As the world's technologies advanced, along with the way people sought knowledge on the internet — including through "smarter" smart phones and Algenerated platforms like ChatGPT Wikipedia advanced, too. During the year, the Wikimedia Foundation brought more technical innovation to Wikipedia, including a new data center that ensured millions of people could more quickly access Wikipedia's knowledge from their phones

and computers, as well as new editor tools that gave Wikipedia's contributors crucial ways to add knowledge across Wikipedia.

You'll read about these innovations in this Annual Report, which also details how Wikipedia continues to be an important bulwark against misinformation on the internet, and how Wikipedia continues to produce neutral, verifiable knowledge that adheres to the highest ideals of the internet — or as we like to think of it, "The Internet We Were Promised."

All the work we did helped lead to an important recognition after the year was over: Wikipedia was named a "digital public good" by a notable United Nationsendorsed alliance. The recognition highlights Wikipedia's unique role in advancing global access to a free and open source of trusted knowledge in the public interest.

As a nonprofit committed to Wikipedia's operations and its future, the Wikimedia Foundation collaborates with contributors and donors around the world to ensure that the knowledge on Wikipedia and its sister projects is a trusted source in over 300 languages not just English. In the 2023-2024 fiscal year, Wikipedia became more representative of the world, with contributors who hailed from virtually every country on Earth. Wikipedia is always adding new articles, and is reaching new people who realize just how important

Wikipedia is to the modern internet. Everyone who engaged with Wikipedia in the 2023-2024 fiscal year had an impact on Wikipedia — whether you were an editor, a donor, or a reader.

Thank you. Year after year, donors and other contributors are what make Wikipedia so vital to the world. You gave Wikipedia what it needed the most this past year: The gift of your time. Taking a minute to donate — just like taking a minute to add knowledge — helped Wikipedia continue to grow and reach more people. Thanks again for what you did to make Wikipedia even better for everyone.

Technical breakthroughs benefited millions and millions of users. One of the year's highlights: dark mode!



Its name evokes images of outer space at night, but "dark mode" is a down-to-earth software feature that lets users — including those with visual impairments — read website pages with less eye strain. At the end of the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the Wikimedia Foundation made dark mode available on a wide number of Wikimedia projects, which prompted celebrations among users, including from one user who said our announcement was "the biggest news on the day for me."

Dark mode, which is also called "night mode," is a breakthrough on Wikipedia, enhancing the reading experience and establishing a feature widely requested by editors. Dark-mode users say it improves screen readability in low-light environments — which goes beyond the importance of simply reading Wikipedia. The American Academy of Ophthalmology, for example, recommends dark mode for those using a computer screen

at night since the blue light from screens, it says, can interrupt a body's circadian rhythm and disrupt sleep.

Until recently, dark mode wasn't possible on Wikipedia due to technical challenges, especially the amount of manual work required to update the colors of templates and other content to ensure dark mode's accessibility. Staff members on the Wikimedia Foundation's web team were able to collaborate

with technical volunteers to address those challenges — a partnership that ultimately led to dark mode's debut. So important were the volunteers' contributions that Jon Robson, who headed the work's engineering part, created a dedicated web page to thank the volunteers for their intricate technical help. Robson's post announcing the debut of dark mode ended with a simple hope: that readers enjoy the new experience. But behind that wish is something bigger. Dark mode represents the culmination of countless hours of effort — not just by one person, but by a global community of volunteers and staff working together in service

of millions of Wikipedia readers. It's a reminder that Wikipedia is built not for profit or praise, but for people. This is what collaboration looks like. This is what the internet we were promised can still be.

What is the bigger context of Wikipedia's dark mode? Throughout the year, the Wikimedia Foundation's Product and Technology departments work diligently to improve the resilience, security, and scalability of our projects' technology infrastructure — all to ensure that Wikipedia remains fast, reliable, and accessible to users worldwide, even during periods of extraordinary demand.

Further Breakthroughs during 2023-2024 included:

- Expanding "Machine in Translation (MinT)," a project by the Language Team that makes it easier than ever to translate articles and information on the Wikimedia projects. MinT is used by volunteers to translate information in more than 150 languages many of them languages that are underrepresented on the internet, 44 for which MinT is the first and only tool available for translation.
- "Community Configuration 2.0," an initiative that is helping volunteer
 administrators on the Wikimedia projects configure editing tools more
 easily which is leading to better edits across Wikipedia. Further, it
 was built on a software extension that helps communities customize
 features to meet their unique needs.
- The Wikimedia Foundation's first data center in South America, which
 is giving millions of people better access to Wikipedia's knowledge
 base lowering pageload times, and improving user experience.

Goal 2: Expanding knowledge for all by closing content gaps

Bolstering women's biographies means bettering knowledge for everyone on Wikipedia



Behind every article on Wikipedia is a lineup of people who cared deeply about that article's subject. Articles take time to be created and curated, and the volunteer writers and editors benefit from behind-the-scenes support that helps expand Wikipedia's knowledge base. That's why the 2023–2024 fiscal year was so important for addressing one of Wikipedia's most persistent knowledge gaps: articles about women.

When women's stories, achievements, and contributions are missing, the public's understanding of history, science, culture, and countless other fields is incomplete. A more balanced Wikipedia benefits everyone who turns to the site for learning and discovery—especially in a world where generative AI tools are trained on its content.

During the year the Wikimedia Foundation worked with volunteer editors and affiliate organizations to undertake myriad initiatives to help address the lack of articles including:

 We provided support for WikiWomen Summit and WikiWomen Camp — two important gatherings for editors and organizers who are working to share more information about women on Wikipedia. The Foundation's support helped alleviate the administrative and coordination burden that volunteers faced to organize these key inperson meetings and strategic events.

- We bolstered the way we supported organizers who are bringing in newcomers and retaining contributors interested in addressing the issue. The Foundation's support included improving the Organizer Lab, a 12-week online training course that hones the skills that organizers need to run consistent, high-impact campaigns that invite new contributors to edit Wikipedia
- We supported the work of contributors interested in addressing the content gap in women's biographies and women's health. The Foundation worked closely with our affiliate in Indonesia, Wikimedia Indonesia, in their partnership with the United Nations Population Fund that focused on adding and improving Indonesian-language Wikipedia articles about women's health.

Also in the year, the Foundation launched the "Wikipedia Needs More Women" campaign, which encouraged people around the world to help improve Wikipedia by adding and improving articles about notable women. The campaign featured two explanatory webpages, and reached millions of people around the world. It also amplified the work that Wikimedia volunteers do each year during Women's History Month and directed audiences to join in on the global activities. Since then, the number of biographies on English Wikipedia about women has surpassed the 20 percent threshold.

Fittingly, the news of the breakthrough broke on the website of Women in Red, an editing project that began in 2015 to address Wikipedia's content disparity. No one group can close a knowledge gap on Wikipedia, and scores of volunteer groups like Women in Red and volunteer

editors like Jess Wade are trying one article at a time — to enhance Wikipedia's knowledge about women. Bolstering that knowledge means bettering knowledge for everyone on Wikipedia. That's why the Wikimedia Foundation celebrates the progress that was made across Wikipedia in 2023-2024. As Rosie Stephenson-Goodknight, a prominent Women in Red organizer (and former Wikimedia Foundation Trustee) said after the 20-percent breakthrough was announced: "This is huge news for anyone who uses the internet... How incredible that we did this together!"

That spirit of collaboration is what makes Wikipedia's progress so meaningful. Strengthening women's representation ensures that future generations encounter a fuller, richer, and more truthful reflection of the world—one where all contributors to society are recognized and documented.

Goal 3: Combating mis/disinformation, censorship, and other threats to free knowledge

Protecting access to Wikipedia and the contributors who add knowledge—was a top priority throughout the year



Reliable information has always been the bedrock of Wikipedia and the Wikimedia Foundation's other free knowledge projects, and it's especially crucial now when misinformation is so common. Wikipedia is an important bulwark against misinformation on the internet, and that's one reason why protecting access to Wikipedia's knowledge, and why protecting the people who add knowledge to Wikimedia's projects, is more important than ever.

During the 2023-2024 fiscal year, teams across the Wikimedia Foundation were proactive in continuing to ensure our sites' availability for readers and for contributors. Two teams in particular drive this work forward: Human Rights, which supports the safety and security of volunteers

who are at risk of persecution, reprisal, or harassment for their good-faith participation in the Wikimedia projects; and Global Advocacy, which advocates for public policies that promote and support access to the knowledge on Wikimedia's projects.

Below are just two examples from these teams' efforts of the past year, with names of people and specific countries withheld to protect the identities of the volunteers:

- A community member covering large-scale protests in their city
 was arrested and detained as a result of their contributions to
 Wikimedia projects. The Wikimedia community rallied around the
 volunteer, and the Human Rights Team mobilized local and regional
 support immediately to help secure an attorney. The volunteer was
 subsequently released.
- A prominent community member was repeatedly threatened by authorities and members of their government, forcing them to flee and seek asylum. The Human Rights Team worked to support the volunteer's security and asylum process. Throughout this challenging ordeal the volunteer has continued to contribute to Wikimedia projects.

The scope of the Wikimedia projects demands that the Wikimedia Foundation be proactive — as active as the projects' hundreds of thousands of volunteers, some of whom find themselves in extraordinary situations, even as they continue to add knowledge that benefits the world.

Goal 4:

A trusted global nonprofit driving the advancement of all human knowledge

Transparency and accountability continued to be hallmarks of our operations—and our planning for the future



One of the most respected benchmarks in the nonprofit world is a 75% program-expense ratio — the portion of a nonprofit's budget ideally spent directly on programs. Charity Navigator, which evaluates nonprofit operations, uses this ratio to measure effectiveness. They typically consider a ratio of 65% or higher to be acceptable, with anything above 75% seen as exceptional. In the two years leading up to the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the Wikimedia Foundation's program-expense ratio was 76.6% and 76.0%. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, we aimed even higher and achieved 77.5%.

The Wikimedia Foundation makes all our numbers transparent. All our audits, all our Forms 990 (the tax form that U.S. nonprofits file with the government), and all our Annual Plans are available on our website. We believe that transparency goes beyond sharing numbers — every year, we work to make our finances accessible and understandable, contextualizing and explaining the numbers so that donors and community

members can have clear insight into how we use funds to further Wikimedia's mission. It's this commitment to transparency, along with things like our program-expense ratio, funding-efficiency ratio, and liabilities-to-assets ratio that secured the Wikimedia Foundation a 99%, four-out-of-four-star rating from Charity Navigator, its highest star rating for nonprofits.

Transparency and accountability have always been hallmarks for the Wikimedia Foundation, as has been our commitment to plan for the future. All these things continued in the 2023-2024 year, exemplified by the Wikimedia Endowment, which is protecting Wikipedia for future generations while also strengthening Wikipedia day by day, as well as by Wikimedia Enterprise, which is a service focused on high-volume commercial reusers of Wikimedia content. Both the Wikimedia **Endowment and Wikimedia** Enterprise reached new milestones in the year, with the Endowment now at \$144 million — an increase of \$25 million. The Endowment also became its own 501(c)(3) charitable organization, which means it can better support the Wikimedia projects for the long term. Meanwhile, Wikimedia Enterprise brought in \$3.4 million of revenue — an increase from the previous year. Enterprise and the Endowment are diversifying the Wikimedia Foundation's revenue streams while supporting the future sustainability of Wikipedia and the Wikimedia Foundation's other free knowledge projects.

All these numbers speak to the successful outcome of a key Annual Plan goal: Strengthen the Wikimedia Foundation's overall performance for the greater good of the Wikimedia projects. The Wikimedia Foundation is committed to fostering the projects through rigorous accountability, sustainable funding, and widespread community support that advances the projects for everyone who uses them.

CONCLUSION

Wikipedia's story is your story, too

Every year in the life of Wikipedia and its sister projects is a year of close collaboration across continents. By working with volunteers who number in the hundreds of thousands, and by using funding that comes from millions of generous donors, the Wikimedia Foundation aims to shepherd those projects toward new achievements that everyone can be proud of.

This year's stories reflect the many dimensions of our shared work, all contributing to a common goal: advancing knowledge equity across the Wikimedia projects. Knowledge equity refers to making it possible for more people to share reliable knowledge on Wikipedia and other Wikimedia projects. Wikipedia is built on the premise that it becomes better when more people of different backgroundsincluding political persuasions source, edit, curate, and research content. Our knowledge equity goal advances that.



Accountability and transparency are foundational to the Wikimedia Foundation's core values. We are dedicated to managing funds and resources in a way that ensures every contribution supports our mission of advancing knowledge for all.

45% Investment in Technology

12% General and Administrative Expenses





The Wikimedia Endowment is a long-term financial fund established to ensure the sustainability of Wikipedia and other Wikimedia projects. As an independent entity, the Endowment plays a critical role in supporting the Wikimedia movement by securing funding for both immediate needs and long-term goals.

This ensures the ongoing vitality of Wikimedia's global community of users, contributors, and volunteers, empowering them to continue advancing the mission of freely sharing knowledge with people around the world.

Founded with the vision of preserving the open, neutral, and accessible nature of knowledge, the Endowment acts as a financial anchor for Wikipedia, funding innovations that help it adapt to new technologies and meet the growing demands of a global audience. Through its investments in projects like Kiwix, Abstract Wikipedia, Machine Learning, and Wikidata, the Endowment strengthens Wikipedia's technical infrastructure and extends its reach to millions, ensuring that knowledge remains free and accessible for future generations.

This year's Endowment Annual Report highlights the substantial impact of the Endowment's funding, particularly in improving Wikipedia's offline accessibility and advancing its machine learning capabilities. Kiwix, an offline reader for Wikipedia, has become indispensable in regions with limited internet access, benefiting millions of users who otherwise would not be able to access vital knowledge. Additionally, the Abstract Wikipedia project, which strives to create a language-independent version of Wikipedia, has made remarkable progress, enhancing Wikipedia's global reach. The Endowment's support for these and other initiatives underscores its commitment to maintaining Wikipedia's relevance and ensuring it remains the world's most trusted resource for information.

In the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the Endowment's funding not only sustained existing projects but also fueled new innovations that will shape Wikipedia's future. By supporting these advancements, the Endowment continues to fulfill its mission to protect human knowledge. The impact of these efforts is far-reaching, with billions of people relying on Wikipedia for reliable, verifiable, and freely available information. As we look ahead to 2024-2025, the Wikimedia Endowment remains essential in preserving Wikipedia's legacy, ensuring it will be a vital resource for generations to come.




